backgrounds. It is important that candidates can demonstrate an experience, interest and understanding of safeguarding, ensuring that the membership has the appropriate combination of skills, experience and knowledge.

The purpose of this Sub-Committee of the Trustee is to support, assist and advise the Diocesan Trustee in discharging its duties in safeguarding, in accordance with the Trustee's legal and regulatory duties, Trust Deed, Canon Law of the Catholic Church, Charity Commission guidance, and operating within the standards, policies and procedures of the Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency.

The Diocese of Leeds comprises all of West Yorkshire, together with areas in North and East Yorkshire, as well as parts of Lancashire. The 1,500 square miles of this territory include some of the most deprived former industrial inner-city areas as well as more affluent districts and remote rural regions.

The population of lay Catholics in the Diocese numbers around 170,000. We come from diverse backgrounds and traditions, with around 40 languages spoken. Pastoral care is provided in 82 parishes including Leeds Cathedral, with 111 churches served by 104 priests holding parochial office or engaged in pastoral ministry, 45 retired priests, 14 permanent deacons in active ministry and 12 different Religious Orders, Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life.

The diocese has 94 Catholic schools, the majority of which make up five Catholic Multi-Academy Trusts; together with a Sixth Form College, a Catholic University (Leeds Trinity University) and 5 University Chaplaincies.
