POPE FRANCIS I feel all your affection and closeness and ... I feel as if I am 'carried' and supported by all God's people. The Pope continued his treatments, including active motor physiotherapy. As planned, after non-invasive mechanical ventilation during the night, he resumed high-flow oxygen therapy in the morning using nasal cannulas. Pope Francis is continuing some work activities. On Thursday, the Holy Father named Bishop Ángel Francisco Caraballo Fermín as Archbishop of Cumaná, Venezuela, and Bishop Ángel Román Idígoras as Bishop of Albacete, Spain. The Pope has continued to lead the Vatican during his hospital stay and met Cardinal Parolin at the Gemelli. The prognosis remains guarded.

HOLY SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM A date and time for your child's Baptism can be provisionally given once you have completed the parish form and established a relationship with the parish. Godparents play a vital role as Christian role models, so choose wisely. According to Canon Law, godparents must be at least 16 years old, practising Catholics, and have received Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. Parents are responsible for raising their child in the Catholic faith, supported by Catholic schools but primarily through active participation in the Church. Regular Mass attendance, use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and being fully initiated into the Church yourself are essential examples of this commitment. If after reading this information you feel ready to present, your child to the Church for Baptism please see Fr Larkin after Mass for Pre-Baptism form.

First reading

Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Moses spoke to the people: 'The priest shall take the basket from your hand and set it down before the altar of the Lord your God. And you shall make response before the Lord your God, "A wandering Aramean was my father. And he went down into Egypt and sojourned there, few in number, and there he became a nation, great, mighty, and populous. And the Egyptians treated us harshly and humiliated us and laid on us hard labour.
